

Digital and Film Photography

ARTH005057 Credits: 0.5 units / 5 hours

Course Description

This course is an in-depth exploration of the basic techniques and development processes for all types of photography: black-and-white, color, and digital. The inclusion of hands-on projects allows students to develop the technical and expressive skills they need to produce quality pictures. Students are NOT required to have access to a darkroom to successfully complete this course. Students are required to submit their photos in electronic format.

Minimum Camera Requirements: 35 mm manual SLR (Single Lens Reflex) or digital camera with a minimum 6 megapixels and the ability to adjust exposures and shoot in various modes. If using a digital camera, students will need access to basic photo editing software that can output digital images in black-and-white mode and resize images for project submission.

For this course, you will also need the following:

- SLR 35mm manual camera
- 3 rolls 400 speed black-and-white film (either 24 or 36 exposures each)—Kodak T-MAX or Fujifilm Neopan are recommended.

• 2 rolls of ISO 400 color film (either 24 or 36 exposures each)—Fujifilm or Kodak are recommended. AND/OR

• a digital camera with a minimum of 6 megapixels (with instruction manual)

• the ability to shoot digital pictures in black-and-white mode, or access to a basic photo editing software program that will allow you change the mode of the image to black-and-white (or grayscale)

• access to a basic photo editing software program that will allow you to change the size of your digital images to no more than 900 x 640 pixels each.
