Course Description

Health care services make up one of the largest industries in the United States. The number of possible careers and jobs in health care is exploding rapidly today, and the need for health care professionals continues to grow. Whether choosing to work directly with patients, or providing support services, all careers in the health care industry are important, rewarding, and provide benefits to others. This course will provide students with the knowledge and tools they can use to determine if a career in health care is for them.

- 11. Explain the meaning of professionalism of health care workers, describing components of attitude, behaviors, health care skills, and appearance.
- 12. Describe what health care workers should know about culture and individual human needs.
- 13. Describe the relationship between effective communication and quality of patient care.
- 14. Describe what is done when obtaining a history and physical exam, when measuring vital signs, and what data is obtained.
- 15. Describe methods of emergency care, including first aid and cardiopulmonary resuscitation.
