MUSH 031 055 Credits: 0.5 units / 5 hours

Course Description

Through the study of the elements of music theory in this course students will increase their understanding and enjoyment of music. They will study musical notation, major and minor scales, key signatures, intervals, triads, rhythm, and fundamental terminology. Access to a keyboard or musical instrument is NOT required, although it will be helpful. Students who have studied band, orchestra, or voice can succeed in this course, but the course is best suited for those who have studied piano, keyboard or organ.

Graded Assessments: 7 Projects; 2 Proctored Progress Tests

Course Objectives

There are specific objectives listed individually in each lesson The ultimate goal is that, by the end of the course, you will know and use these facts, concepts, principles, theories, and models to gain a better grasp on the theory and practice of music notation.
